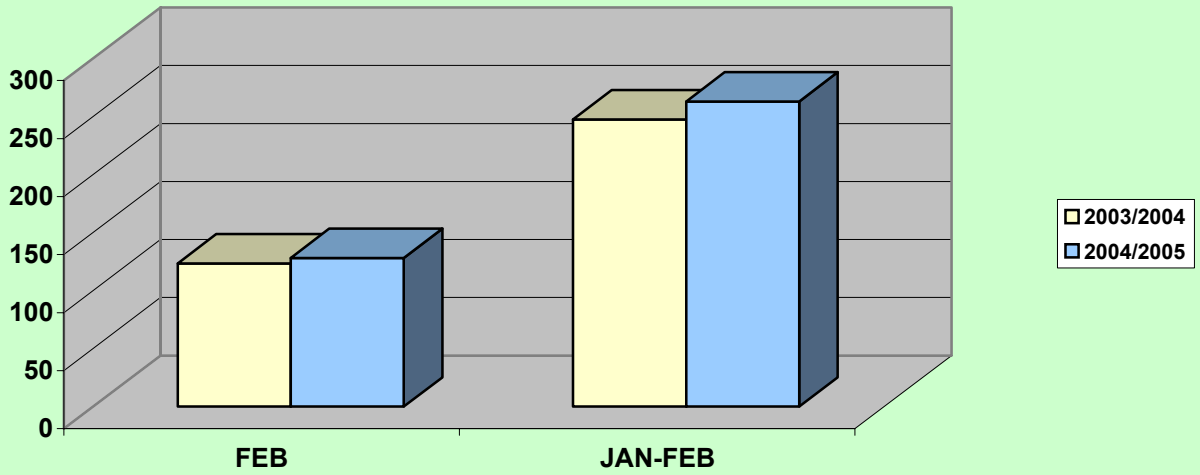

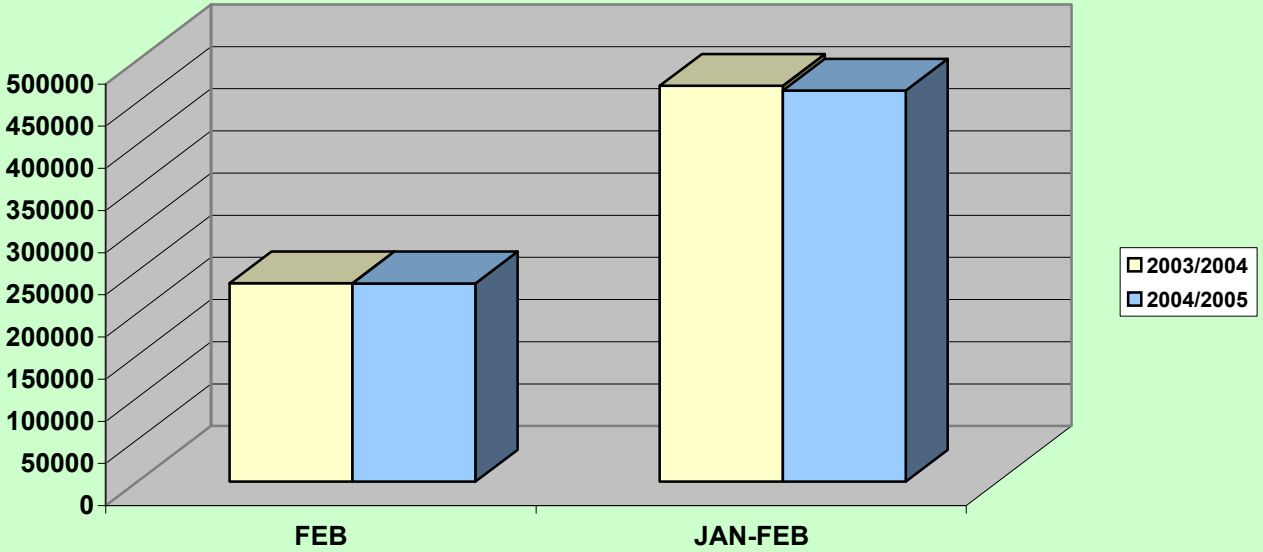

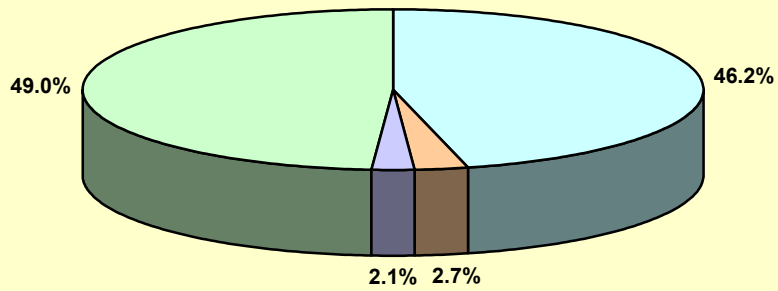
### Estimated Tourist Expenditure (US\$mn)



### Jamaica: Total Visitors

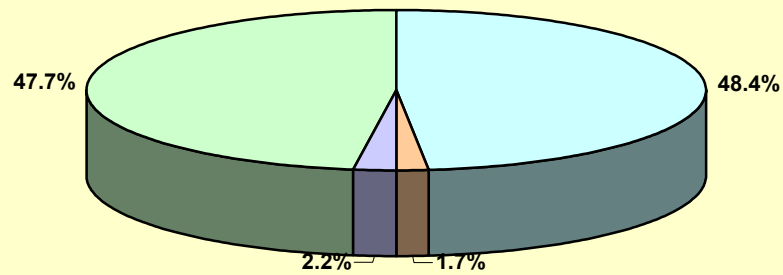


### Composition of Visitors February 2004

### Composition of Visitors February 2005



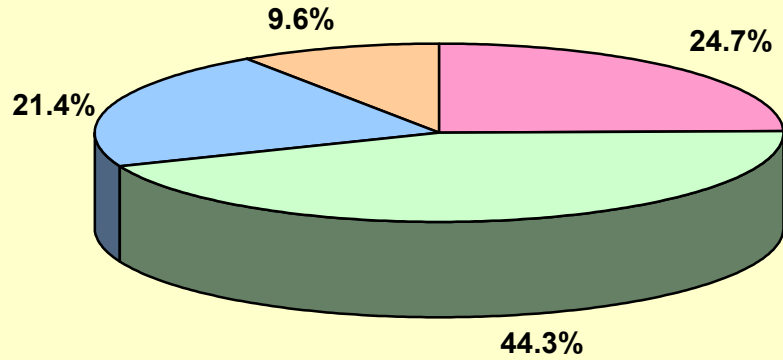

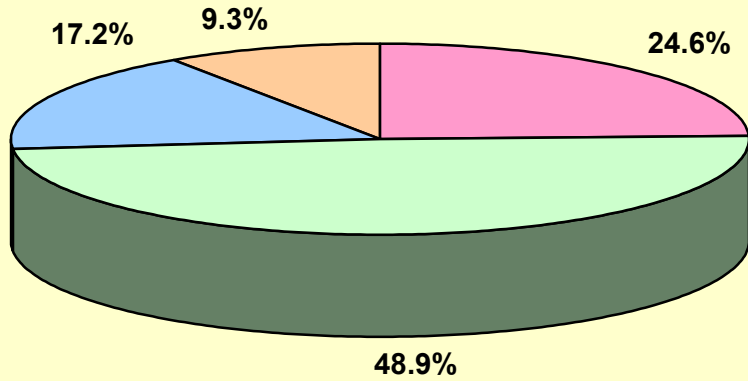
